**DR. BOB MARGEAS*****“Everyday Dentistry:  
More than Everyday Esthetic Results”***

Dr. Margeas graduated from the University of Iowa College of Dentistry in 1986 and completed his AEGD residency the following year. He is currently an adjunct professor in the department of Operative Dentistry at the University of Iowa. He is Board Certified by the American Board of Operative Dentistry. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Aesthetic Dentistry, a Fellow of the Academy of General Dentistry and International Team of Oral Implantologists (ITI).

**DR. BOB LONEY*****“Planning for Success:  
No Treatment to Complete Dentures”***

Dr. Bob Loney received his DMD from the University of Saskatchewan in 1983 and his MS in Prosthodontics from The University of Michigan in 1987. He is currently the Head of the Division of Removable Prosthodontics, and the former Director of Graduate Prosthodontics at Dalhousie University. His research has focused on dental implants, stress analysis and surface metrology of dental materials and prostheses. Dr. Loney was a recipient of the W. W. Wood Award for Excellence in Dental Education in 1992 and 2001 and the 3M-ESPE National Dentistry Teaching Award in 2003. He is a member of the Association of Prosthodontists of Canada and The Atlantic Prosthodontists Society. He has lectured internationally, and published many articles. He loves the outdoors, particularly bicycling, canoeing and skiing. He maintains a part-time practice limited to Prosthodontics in Halifax, NS.

Providing complete or removable partial dentures can be alternatively rewarding or frustrating. The secret is to make most cases as successful as possible. By applying basic, easy to learn principles, practitioners can maximize success and minimize failures.

Learn to identify patients whose expectations exceed possibility. Use a basic 5-step approach to trouble shooting and eliminate problems related to dentures. Use implant overdentures to rehabilitate edentulous patients who previously would have difficulty wearing any prostheses. A top ten list of problems for edentulous patients.

- Identify edentulous patients who can be successfully rehabilitated with removable prostheses

**DR. THOMAS YU*****“Advanced Periodontal Therapy”***

Born in Saskatoon, Dr. Thomas Yu obtained his DMD from the U of S. Dr. Yu then completed a general practitioner residency at Mount Sinai Hospital. His studies continued at the U of Toronto, where he received a Master of Periodontology degree. Before opening his private practice in Calgary, Dr. Yu taught at the U of Toronto dental clinic and pursued studies at Princess Margaret Hospital in Toronto.

In addition to his academic studies, Thomas is also an internationally-acclaimed pianist. He has won international amateur piano competitions in Paris and Vienna, and is a laureate of the Chopin amateur competition in Warsaw. He continues to delight audiences across four continents. To celebrate their centennial year, the U of S has named him one of the top 100 most influential alumni.

This comprehensive lecture will cover the management of osseous defects and furcations, as well as soft tissue grafting. These procedures will also apply to implant sites and there will be a discussion of bone grafting with particular regard to socket and sinus grafting.

**DR. JIM CROSS*****(I) “Anaphylaxis in Your Office”***  
***(II) “Acute Pain Management for the  
Dentist”***

Dr. Jim Cross graduated from the U of S College of Medicine near the bottom of his class in 1973. His main interest has been emergency medicine which he practiced in Saskatoon, Regina, Phoenix, Arizona and Prince Albert. He was a Chief of Emergency Medicine for 16 years and has been a VP of Medicine for the last 7 years. He currently resides at Emma Lake and is looking forward to this coming winter in Yuma, Arizona where he hopes to avoid being referred to as "trailer trash".

**(I) Anaphylaxis in Your Office...**Anaphylaxis can occur at anytime and anywhere including the dentist's office. This presentation will feature a case presentation with an unhappy ending. The focus will be on the recognition of early anaphylaxis and its differentiation from vasovagal syncope as well as its treatment (hint: epinephrine and more epinephrine if required). Mismanagement is common and recommendations will be given on how to avoid this.

**(II) Acute Pain Management for the Dentist...**How to avoid managing acute pain like the Marquis de Sade. A special emphasis will be placed on analgesics to be avoided (and there are many of them) and tips on how to use "good" analgesics in a safe and effective manner.

**DR. TREY PETTY*****“Infection Prevention and Control in  
the New Century”***

Whether you knew it or not, major changes have occurred in Infection Control in the past couple of years. When was the last time your office updated their processes? Dr. Petty will go over the "new rules" of Infection Control in Dentistry (starting with why it's not even called "Infection Control" anymore!), as well as why the "old rules" still apply.

He will discuss what works, what doesn't work, and how to STOP THE INSANITY (of hysteria!), but do what you need to do to protect yourself and your patients, including the new antibiotic prophylaxis guidelines, whom they apply to, and why. Dr. Trey L. Petty is the former Director of Dentistry and Oral Medicine for the Calgary Health Region at the Foothills Medical Centre and the Tom Baker Cancer Centre in Calgary. He recently opened a private practice in Calgary, still limited to the medically-complex patient; the first such private practice in Canada. He is an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Calgary and is the Dental Consultant for Southern Alberta for the Alberta Cancer Board.

His practice is limited to the mentally and physically challenged, medically compromised, infectious patient, head and neck cancer patient, the immunocompromised and many other things that no one else wants to do.
